The next day, the one after Preparation Day, the chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate. Otherwise, his disciples may come and steal the body and tell the people that he has been raised from the dead. This last deception will be worse than the first."

"Take a guard," Pilate answered. "Go, make the tomb as secure as you know how." So they went and made the tomb secure by putting a seal on the stone and posting the guard.



- April 6Scripture from the Passion: John 19:28-37Testimony of the Blacksmith (keepsake: nail)who forged the nails by which Jesus Christ was fastened to the cross
- April 13Scripture from the Passion: Matthew 27:57-66Testimony of the Stone Mason (keepsake: stone)who chiseled out the tomb where Jesus' body was laid
